I am pleased to offer your department the opportunity to participate in our annual end-of-year impaired driving enforcement grant program. The Division of Highway Traffic Safety is prepared to offer your department \$7,500 in overtime enforcement grant funding, to be utilized during the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2014 Year End Holiday Crackdown from December 5, 2014 - January 2, 2015.

If you choose to accept this invitation, you will submit your grant application on-line through the SAGE e-grant system. Detailed instructions follow. Please read the instructions carefully. The application for this grant will be available in SAGE beginning on September 29, 2014 and must be submitted to NJDHTS by November 14, 2014.

When you access the grant application in SAGE, please familiarize yourself with the Project Methodology, as you will be expected to adhere to all components of it. This is a reimbursement grant, meaning your agency will incur the costs and then submit documentation to the Division, also through the SAGE system, to be reimbursed. The maximum hourly rate that will be reimbursed for the enforcement overtime is \$50 per hour.

As per directives from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (which provides the federal funding for this grant) Chiefs of Police are not eligible to work grant-funded overtime through this and other DHTS grants.

After you have submitted your completed application through SAGE, you will be notified of your approval through SAGE, as well. No written approvals will be sent out.
