SABATER ELEMENTARY SRTS 2014 – PHASE 2 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The work of this project will consist of the removal and replacement of handicapped accessible sidewalk ramps, removal and replacement of all signage (including the installation of new "Share the Road" signs), and the restriping of all stop bars and crosswalks within the limits of the project. The proposed improvements will add to pedestrian safety, bicyclist safety, as well as motorist safety.

Project limits are shown on the accompanying Project Location Map, and include:

Southwest Boulevard (Landis to Chestnut) Southeast Boulevard (Landis to Chestnut)

Handicapped accessible sidewalk ramps which are not in conformance with Federal standards are to be redesigned to better conform to those standards. Each ramp will be individually designed, ensuring conformance with the Public Right-Of-Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAAG). This should further encourage pedestrian use of the sidewalks by all people, especially those with handicaps.

Much of the signage within the project limits is faded or otherwise not in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). Replacing these signs allow motorists to better make decisions which have a direct impact on the safety of pedestrians and bicyclists in the area. The addition of "Share the Road" signs should encourage the use of bicycles within the project limits.
