

PURCHASING AGENT REVIEW COV BID # 2019-16 REVISED 6/18/19

GWP Enterprises Inc. has submitted their letter of withdrawal for this project within the time limit for Bid withdraws. After reviewing their request and the bid prices for each line item I'm not sure that I agree with their assessment that the error was in the traffic control. If any errors, I would say it was in the Milling and Asphalt line items. GWP was significantly higher (over \$80,000) on these 2 items than that of the 2nd lowest bidder. Add the plus \$8,000 for the Casting line item brings the difference to \$88,000. Although it may not appear significant it would be in this case as the total project costs is about \$200,000. I have no issues granting their withdraw request and awarding to the next lowest responsive responsible bidder (NJB NJ Contractors LLC). In my professional opinion I believe that GWP may have made an honest mistake in their Bid as previously stated and by forcing the award on GWP may be cause for possible change orders that could significantly increase the final cost to the City. A bidder is only able to withdraw their bid if they believe or find that they made an error in their Bid cost. They are not allowed to submit a revised bid. If the using department after review and clarification of the request agrees that request should be accepted the next move would be to recommend acceptance of GWP's withdraw request and award to the next lowest responsive responsible bidder.

Additional Comment: After review and discussion with David Maillet, Acting City Engineer we agree that GWP's bid prices for the Milling & Asphalt appear to be under bid. Like Dave, I feel that allowing their withdraw request is in the best interest of both parties and more importantly avoid potential change orders that could exceed the second lowest bid. As much as I would like to agree with Dave to bar GWP from future road work, I must disagree as it violates NJ Public Contracts Law for debarment. In order to bar a potential bidder there are reasons and procedures that must be followed. If Legal agrees with this assessment I recommend we move forward with award to NJB NJ Contractors LLC in the amount of \$200,251.96 contingent upon availability of funding.

Dear Mike and DJ,

As I understand the issue, we received several bids for spot paving for 2019. The apparent low bidder was GWP Enterprises which was quite a bit lower than the next closes bidder and @ \$7,000 below the engineers estimate. Subsequent to bid opening, GWP requested to rescind their bid indicating they made an error in calculations. The error was apparent to DJ and was quite substantial. The issue of withdrawing a bid is determined by a 4 prong test set up by our courts. The test is as follows

- 1. The mistake must be of so great a consequence that the enforce the contract as actually made would be unconscionable.
- 2. The matter as to which the mistake was made must relate to the material feature of the contract
- 3. The mistake must have occurred notwithstanding the exercise of reasonable care by the party making the mistake
- 4. The City must be able to get relief by way of rescission without serious prejudice to the other party, except for loss of his bargain.

As I understand from DJ, all of the above 4 prong test has been met and therefore, we can allow the apparent low bidder to withdraw their bid and award to the second low bidder, NJB NJ Contractors LLC, which leads to the issue surrounding their bid.

As I understand the facts, NJB entered the room where the bids were being opened at 2:03 pm, 3 minutes past the deadline. I understand that the company was in the building prior to the deadline and were in fact first at the VPD and then to the City Clerk. This was confirmed by the VPD and Clerk's Office. I believe that the fact they were in the Clerk's Office prior to the time limit would put them within the timeframe for receipt of the bid. While being late is totally their fault, it is not fair to them if they arrived at the VPD well before the deadline and it took time to get directions. Same with their arrival at the clerk's office.
