AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 90-58 ESTABLISHING NO PARKING RESTRICTIONS ALONG A PORTION OF ALMOND STREET.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Vineland, on June 26, 1990, adopted Ordinance No. 90-58, entitled “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 939 AND PROVIDING FOR NO PARKING RESTRICTIONS ON CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF VINELAND;” and

WHEREAS, it is considered to be necessary and in the best interest of the City of Vineland that said Ordinance No. 90-58 be repealed due to the fact that parking restrictions along Almond Street, from the westerly curblineline of Howard Street to a point 185 feet west thereof, is no longer needed due to the relocation of the old EMS Station; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Vineland that Ordinance No. 90-58 adopted by the City Council of the City of Vineland on June 26, 1990, be and the same is hereby repealed.
