

REGULAR WORK SESSION

The Regular Work Session of the City Council of the City of Vineland was called to order by the President, Paul F. Spinelli.

President Spinelli led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Municipal Clerk stated Public Notice of this meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given on December 11, 2019 by the City Clerk in the following manner:

President Spinelli asked if anyone from the public would like to comment.

There being no one to be heard, President Spinelli invited Victor Terenik, director of Management Information Systems, to discuss issues. Mr. Terenik explained that there are some stand-alone applications, but he would prefer to be using broader use programs. Because of the pandemic, the Harris contract was renewed for another year. President Spinelli requested a report when future programs/applications are considered to evaluate how they integrate with others.

The Municipal Clerk reviewed the agenda.

Councilman Franceschini stated that three city employees have tested positive for covid-19, and there are also seven children in Vineland who tested positive. He stated that masks are essential to control the spread.

Councilman Vargas reported that PAL is still trying work out having activities like tennis and fishing. They are waiting for Health Department input and advice.

Solicitor Tonetta advised that a motion to amend the Energy and Minerals Condemnation Redevelopment Area plan will be on Tuesday's agenda. This motion will request findings of fact and recommendations relating to the proposed plan to allow a 9-hole golf course, driving range, clubhouse and restaurant, indoor firearms training/shooting range, and soccer field at the property known as 4031 South Lincoln Avenue.
